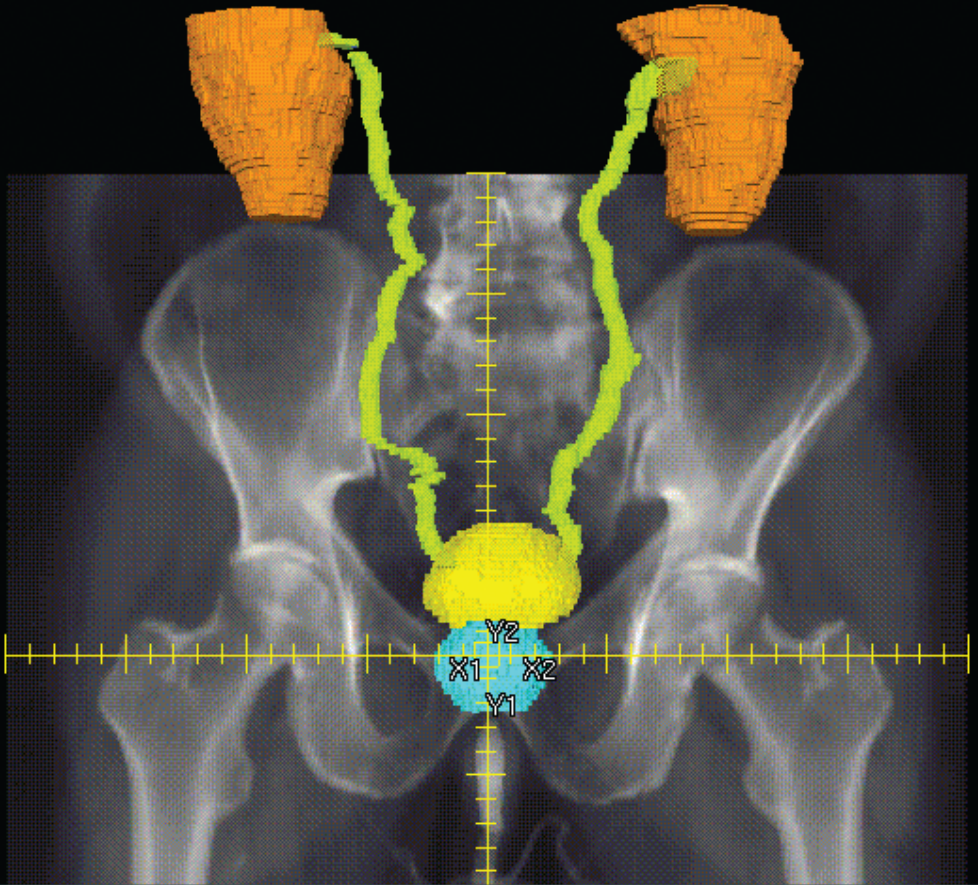

You are cordially invited to join us for the 2010 Northeastern Genitourinary Oncology Symposium (NGOS), co-sponsored by the academic medical centers of McGill University, University of Vermont, and Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center. The Symposium provides a venue for the sharing of current information across specialty specific and national boundaries and will be of interest to anyone involved in the care and management of patients diagnosed with a GU malignancy. The faculty will provide a spectrum of evidence-based perspectives that will help inform decision-making for these patients in your care.

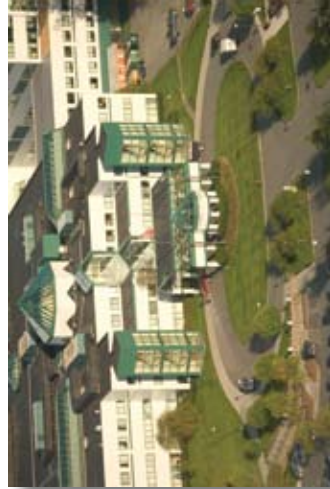
